THE SSTF'S WORK CENTERS AROUND BUILDING THE CAPACITY OF K-12 SCHOOL SAFETY COMMUNITY AND ADMINISTERING THE FEDERAL SCHOOL SAFETY CLEARINGHOUSE AND SCHOOLSAFETY.GOV

 - Provide a vital link for information sharing in steady state and incident response

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

The list of school violence incidents is not intended to be exhaustive, but rather to illustrate the breadth of the problem.


WHAT THE THREAT DATA IS SAYING...

	TARGETED VIOLENCE	77% percent of public schools recorded one or more incidents of crime, amounting to 1.4 million incidents. A rate of 29 incidents per 1,000 students. ¹
	CYBERSECURITY THREATS	MALICIOUS CYBER ACTORS ARE TARGETING SCHOOL COMPUTER SYSTEMS, DISRUPTING ACCESS, AND RENDERING THE SYSTEMS UNABLE TO PERFORM BASIC FUNCTIONS. ²
<u> </u>	HOAX CALLS & SWATTING	FROM SEPTEMBER 2022 TO OCTOBER 2022 K-12 SCHOOLS REPORTED NEARLY 200 SWATTING AND HOAX INCIDENTS IN 28 STATES ³
	MENTAL HEALTH	44% of high school students reported they persistently felt sad or hopeless during the past year. ⁴
	ANIMATING GRIEVANCES	Lone offenders' and groups motivated by a range of ideological and/or personal grievances continue to pose a persistent threat to schools. ⁵





PROTECTIVE SECURITY ADVISOR / CYBER SECURITY ADVISOR SERVICES & SUPPORTS

PSA / CSA Mission Areas

- Protective Security Advisors (PSAs) / Cyber Security Advisors (CSAs) have five mission areas that directly support the protection of critical infrastructure:
 - Plan, coordinate, and conduct security surveys and assessments
 - Plan and conduct outreach activities (supporting K-12 Schools is a CISA priority)
 - Support National Special Security Events (NSSEs) and Special Event Activity Rating (SEAR) events
 - Respond to incidents
 - Coordinate and support improvised explosive device awareness and risk mitigation training (PSAs only)



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PSA Assist Visits (A/V)


- Establish and enhance CISA's relationship with critical infrastructure owners and operators; inform them of the importance of their facilities, and reinforce the need for continued vigilance
- During an Assist Visit, PSAs focus on coordination, outreach, training, and education
- Assist Visits are often followed by security surveys using the Infrastructure Survey Tool (IST) or Security Assessment at First Entry (SAFE) or delivery of other CISA services



CSA Cyber Protective Visit (CPV)

- One-on-one engagement to understand the organization's needs, and develop the foundation for further engagements and offerings
- During a Cyber Protective Visit, CSAs focus on promoting collaborative efforts to reduce risks and threats to critical information, enterprise, communications and control systems
- Assist Visits are often followed by cybersecurity surveys using the Cyber Resilience Review (CRR), Ransomware Readiness Assessment (RRA), Crosssector Cyber Performance Goals (CPG) or delivery of other CISA services

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





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IMPORTANCE OF EARLY IDENTIFICATION

THE FACTORS THAT CONTRIBUTE TO YOUTH VIOLENCE ARE COMPLEX AND FAR-RANGING, BUT RESEARCH SHOWS THAT EARLY IDENTIFICATION OF THREATENING OR CONCERNING BEHAVIORS AND INTERVENTION REDUCES VIOLENCE.



DURING THE 2019–2020 SCHOOL YEAR, **80 PERCENT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS** RECORDED THAT ONE OR MORE INCIDENTS OF VIOLENCE, THEFT, OR OTHER CRIMES HAD TAKEN PLACE, AMOUNTING TO **1.4 MILLION INCIDENTS.**




IN 2020, STUDENTS AGES 12–18 EXPERIENCED **285,400 VICTIMIZATIONS AT SCHOOL**, TRANSLATING TO A RATE OF 11.2 VICTIMIZATIONS PER 1,000 STUDENTS AT SCHOOL.


