2023-25 Biennial Budget Process

- We are in the first year of the current biennial budget (FY24).
- DPI will likely submit its departmental budget request for 2025-27 in November 2024.
- Gov. Evers will likely release his proposal in February 2025.
- The Legislative Joint Committee of Finance will work on the 2025-27 budget and related documents through the spring/summer of 2025.
- Ideally the final budget for FY26 and FY27 will be completed prior to July 1, 2025.


What is a Categorical Aid?

- > Targeted purpose
- Outside revenue limit
- Offsets shared cost

What is a Categorical Aid?

- > Usually "sum-certain," often prorated
- > Three broad types
 - Reimbursement
 - > Formula
 - Grant

Categorical Aid Funding



Special Education & School-Age Parents Aid

- > \$558,036,700 in FY24; \$574,777,700 in FY25
- Districts, Independent Charters Schools (ICS), CESAs, CCDEBs
- Reimbursement of prior year eligible costs
 - Salary & benefits of licensed staff
 - > IEP-required specialized transportation
 - Limited contracting
- Sum-certain, prorated (31.5% in March payment)
 - Paid in 6 installments
- Special Education & School-Age Parents Aid

High Cost Special Education Aid

- > \$13,032,000 in FY24; \$14,480,000 in FY25
- Districts, Independent Charter Schools, CESAs, CCDEBs
- Average <u>reimbursement</u> rate of individual pupil costs over \$30,000 in 2022-23 was 29.1%, after SPED/SAP aid was deducted
- Sum-certain, prorated if necessary
 - Paid in June

High Cost SPED Aid: How do you get it?

- Deadline for 2023-24 claims for 2022-23 student costs was March 11, 2024.

Per Pupil Aid

- > \$591,003,000 in FY24; \$587,812,400 in FY25
- Per pupil aid is for districts only
- > \$742 per pupil; calculated by DPI
 - Uses Revenue Limit membership Line 6 less Special Needs Scholarship Program (SNSP) and New Charter Authorizer membership (ICS)
- Sum-sufficient (\$742 pp is guaranteed in FY24 and FY25)
 - Paid in March

Achievement Gap Reduction

- > \$109,184,500 in FY24 & FY25
- Replaced the SAGE program at the end of the 2017-18 school year
- Focused on closing achievement gaps
 - Tutoring, teacher coaching, or class size reduction
- Progress reporting to DPI and your board
- AGR payments are per-pupil:

Common School Fund (Library Aid)

- Common School Fund is \$65,000,000 in FY24 (25% increase YOY)
- Districts only
- Allocation based on resident population of children ages 4-20 (school census); reporting opens in June, closes in August
- For purchase of library materials
- Each district is expected to estimate their CSF amount in their Authorization: Art. X, ss. 2 & 5, own budget reports.

 Wis. Constitution; s. 43.70, Stats.

Common School Fund (Library Aid)

- BCPL provides an estimate of the funds available in January
 - CSF allocation will be approximately \$56.87 per student
 - Estimate = final payment to help districts plan
- Districts are expected to spend this money during the current school year; no carry-over is the goal
 - Paid in late April, must be spent by end of June
- Common School Fund information

- Pupil Transportation Aid FY24 & FY25 is \$24,000,000/year
- Formula based on number of pupils transported in mileage categories
- Sum-certain, paid in January
- Remaining balance distributed proportionally in June, based on share of audited January payment

- Recently revised: Increased payment, and distance from student's residence to school only factor to be considered for summer school interim.
- Districts are not required to transport for summer/interim sessions to the same standard as during the regular school year.

High Cost Transportation Aid

- High Cost Transportation Aid is \$22,800,000 in FY24 & FY25
 - To districts only and based on previous school year data
- For districts with audited cost/member of 140% of statewide average and 50 or fewer students per square mile.
 - > \$200,000 will go to districts that qualified the year before but not in the current school year, equal to 50%, prorated if necessary.
- Formula based on per-member Fund 10 transportation expenses and calculated by DPI
- Sum-certain, prorated (66.8% in FY22)
 - Paid in June

Appropriation: s. 20.255(2)(cq)

Sparsity Aid

- Sparsity Aid in FY24 & FY25 is \$28,614,000
- Districts only
- Formula based on membership and density; calculated by DPI
- > Starting in FY22: two tiers of aid eligibility
 - > \$400 pp: <745 members, <10 members/mi²
 - > \$100 pp: 746-1,000 members, <10 members/mi²
 - > 50% stop-gap for previously aided but now ineligible
- Sum-certain, prorated if necessary (98.8% in FY24)
 - Paid in September

Bilingual-Bicultural Programs

- Funding for FY24 & FY25 is \$10,089,800/year
- Districts only
- Reimbursement of prior year eligible costs
- Eligibility based on school ELL enrollment
- Sum-certain, prorated if necessary (7.7% in FY23)
 - Paid in December
- Bilingual-Bicultural Programs





- Sum-certain, prorated if necessary
 - Paid in June

High Poverty Aid

- High Poverty Aid for FY24 and onward is \$0/year
 - Funds repurposed for general equalization aids
 - Statutory language and appropriation retained
- Districts only
- ➤ Eligibility A school district is eligible for aid if at least 50% (after rounding to the nearest whole percentage point) of the district's student enrollment on the third Friday in September in the immediately preceding even-numbered year satisfied the income eligibility criteria to be eligible for free or reduced-price lunch (i.e., economically disadvantaged).

 - Formerly paid in March

Mental Health Categorial Aid Program

- > \$12,000,000 GPR in FY24 & FY25
- Mental Health Categorical Aid Program supports the expansion of mental health services to students by providing state reimbursements for expenditures on social worker services.
- Two-tiered program

Authorization: s. 115.364 Administrative Code Sec. PI 31 Appropriation: s. 20.255(2)(da)

Mental Health Categorial Aid Program

- Eligible school districts, private schools, and independent charter schools may receive partial reimbursement for salary and fringe benefits paid to employ, hire, or retain social workers or the costs to contract for the services of a social worker when the eligible entity increased in its expenditures in the prior school year compared to the immediately preceding school year.
- June aid payments are prorated if the appropriation does not fully cover total aid eligibility
- Claim form deadline was March 8, 2024.

- School-Based Mental Health Services Grant provides \$25,000,000 GPR in FY24 & FY25

Categorical aid is state or federal aid that is intended to finance or reimburse some specific category or instructional or supporting program, or to aid a particular target group of pupils. The district may only use the aid for the purpose for which it was paid. Categorical aid can be contrasted with general aid in that districts are not restricted in their use of general aid.
