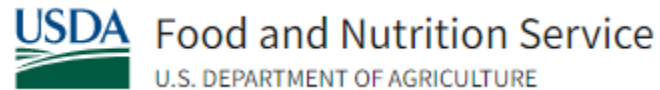

WI AB 805

- [WI Legislative Bill – AB 805](#)

Guarantees that an eligible school will receive a total amount in State and federal aid that will reimburse the school an amount equal to the free reimbursement rate for each breakfast and lunch meal served.

Service for Maximum ADP

- You have it, now what?
- Speed limited by POS (with STD C&C)-need to claim by eligibility and so need student name
- BIC, BAB, kiosks in hallways, bags at door
- Hire staff to allow pre-bagging/bundling, more POS locations
- Budget for higher paper costs
